Stephan Procházka studied Arabic and Turkish in Vienna, Istanbul, and Tunis. 1990 he got his PhD in Arabic Studies. He was a guest lecturer in Innsbruck, Cádiz, and Uppsala; since 2006 he holds the Chair of Arabic Studies at the University of Vienna. His focus of research lies on Arabic linguistics, particularly on modern spoken varieties of Arabic. He also published on topics related to religious minorities and popular culture in the Middle East and North Africa. Stephan Procházka was the head of several large third party funded projects dedicated to different fields of research such as Bedouin culture in Southern Tunisia, studies in early Islamic bureaucracy, linguistic change in the Middle Atlas Mountains, and linguistic dynamics in the greater Tunis area.
